The library has offered books to the community

since it began. In 2018, donor support made it possible to add 733 books to the library's collection, as well as books given to children and families as part of Foundation-funded learning programs.

Early learners

Your gifts in 2018 made it possible for all three libraries to refresh the well-loved play areas with new toys, dolls, and puzzles, so that every child in our

community can interact with materials that promote brain development, love of learning, and readiness for school.

Honoring Their Philanthropy

Olga Walker loved the Duluth Public Library.

When Mrs. Walker died in 1964, her will designated the library as her sole beneficiary, and it directed that her \$50,000 bequest be placed in trust for 21 years. After that time, the Library Board could determine how to use the gift. In 1990, they used it as the seed money for an endowment to benefit the library in perpetuity and created the Duluth Library Foundation to manage it.

Mrs. Walker's gift has been increased by donations from like-minded donors who value the library as a public treasure. The endowment helps provide a measure of stability for the library and enhances what it is able to offer.

In 2018, the Foundation hosted its 3rd Annual Olga Walker Memorial Awards, honoring three couples who have generously supported the library through the Duluth Library Foundation: John and Elaine Killen, Robert and Ann Mars, and Walter and Alyce Rauschenfels.

We are grateful for their gracious philanthropy in support of the Duluth Public Library.

Milissa's generous monthly contributions and the steady donations of all of our sustaining donors create stable funding in support of a vibrant library with resources—including books—that are available to all.



A Case of Identity



On April 30, 2018, author Brian Freeman stood at a wooden podium at Glensheen mansion. To his left and right, a man and a woman--victims? villains?--were perched on stools. A crowd of 100 people sat facing the trio. In his hand, the author held a copy of his about-to-be released new book, Alter Ego.

The audience waited in suspense.

Seven months earlier, the author had been a featured speaker at a different Duluth landmark, the library, where he was part of the fundraising event "Learning & Libations at the Library." That evening, he allowed the Foundation to auction off the name of a character in his next book.

The auctioneer had stepped forward with Brian at his side. The bidding was fast and furious. Soon, only two bidders were left, Lori Fulkerson and Dean Casperson. They fought it out, raising the stakes, until the moment that Lori made a bid and Dean let it go.

The character was hers.

Then Dean approached Brian. If he donated his highest bid to the Foundation, would the author include his name as the male character in the book? The author agreed.

Now two characters in the book Alter Ego, set in Duluth, would be named after two real Duluthians.

Seven months later, at Glensheen, Brian recounted this story to the audience. Then he paused.

After months of waiting, the moment of truth had arrived. Had Brian made Lori and Dean victims, or villains? Good, or evil? Major characters, or bit parts?

Brian opened the book and began to read. The expectant crowd hung on every word. The characters Lori Fulkerson and Dean Casperson came to life, and people gasped in astonishment, then looked at Lori and Dean. They now knew who they were.

Brian closed the book and took questions from the audience. Then he, Lori, and Dean were seated at a long table nearby, pens in hand. Each guest received a copy of Alter Ego and stood in line to have their book inscribed by author Brian Freeman—and by the real Lori Fulkerson and Dean Casperson.

President's Message 2019

As midyear approaches, I can confidently report that the Duluth Library Foundation remains vitally engaged in the life of the Duluth Public Library. Thanks to your generous investment in the library, our annual fundraising is on budget, and we expect to sustain the increased contributions to the library initiated last year. In 2017 the Foundation contributed \$42,000 to support book acquisition, programming, and services, and with your help we were able to increase that to \$50,000 in 2018. Expressing our support of childhood literacy, \$18,000 of last year's gifts were focused on children.

Changes are underway at the Main Library. Superior Street construction last summer led to a decline in downtown use, but it picked up at the two branches. Traffic downtown promptly increased on completion of the street. Internally, the computers from the cramped computer lab were moved upstairs to a sunlit, spacious area in the west corner of the building. There, your contributions helped the library purchase a portion of the new tables and chairs for the rechristened Computer Center. The vacated computer lab space will undergo renovation this fall for much needed restrooms.

The Foundation's mission continues to be support of the library through sponsorship of programming and acquisition of books, materials, and furniture and to grow our endowment to ensure long-term engagement. Our current vision is to increase our advocacy for investment in early childhood literacy. This was the first goal of the five-year Strategic Plan 2016-2020 developed by the library four years ago. There was broad support as the plan was being developed, and there have been successful early literacy initiatives in Duluth in the past, which unfortunately were unsustained due to lack of funding.

Nationwide, studies over the past 25 years or so have documented the benefits of early literacy both to individuals and to the community as a whole. Children who are well prepared to start school with pre-literacy training earn better grades through their school careers and have a greater probability of graduating from high school and finding work. They are less likely to engage in criminal activity and more likely to remain in the workforce and support the community as taxpayers. The most optimistic study I've reviewed documents a 17 percent long-term return on the initial investment in early literacy programs. In its responsibility to advocate for the library, the Foundation intends this year and next to focus on achieving the Strategic Plan's goal of enhancing childhood literacy in our city.

I thank all our valued contributors for assistance in this important work and hope that our ongoing efforts warrant your continued support.
